ULC's Community Land Trust

- 1. ULC acquires land and buildings and partners with vertical developers and nonprofits to own the improvements, aka "the built space" Over 60 acres are in land trusts.
- 2. ULC leases the land to the owner of the improvements for 99 years.
- 3. The 99-year land lease is renewable for an additional 99 years, creating 198 years of **permanent affordability**, thereby ensuring the land will continue to be community benefit in perpetuity.

• Purchased in 2015 and rezoned from light industrial to mixed use


 150 permanently affordable rental apartments and 32,000 SF community health center and local retail, two acres in a ground lease with ULC








Mosaic Community Campus: 25 Acres
